Allowing North Carolina to present a more complete and comprehensive picture of crimes occurring throughout our state.....

REASON FOR CHANGE

- Past system was roughly 20 years old at the time we turned it off ancient in terms of technology
- Need to modernize data collection
- Need to streamline crime data collection into 1 method vs. 3 currently accepted
- Inability to present a true and complete picture of statewide crime
- FBI mandate to transition all states and local agencies to NIBRS by January 1, 2021

BENEFITS OF NIBRS

"NIBRS is a way in which we can all collect data in a way that we can identify patterns, trends, and help us prevent crime and have thoughtful informed conversations at the national level." – former FBI Director James B. Comey

- Consistency
- Support
- Better Data
- Better support from/by RMS vendors
- Potential for future development and partnership with N-DEx



IMPACT ON AGENCIES

- Submissions sent on a schedule decided by individual agencies
- Errors/Warnings are mostly received directly through the RMS rather than a separate website that must be checked regularly
- New validations that must be learned



TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES

- NCSBI/DCI Trainers conducted 9 trainings across the state in fall of 2017
- FBI trainers from the UCR Program conducted 8 trainings between
 November 2016 and October 2018 across the state
- FBI has established NIBRS computer based tutorials through LEEP
- The NCSBI CRU is still looking at the potential of future live trainings as well as possible online training



EFFECT ON CRIME RATES

- Appearance of higher levels of crime to those that misinterpret NIBRS reporting vs. Summary reporting
- Effects on reported crime from an FBI analysis of the NIBRS data and the data that were converted to Summary from 1991-2014:
 - Rape: No effect.
 - Robbery: Increased 0.6 percent.
 - Aggravated Assault: Increased 0.6 percent.
 - Burglary: Increased 1.0 percent.
 - Larceny: Increased 2.6 percent.
 - Motor Vehicle Theft: Increased 2.7 percent.
 - > Total SRS (Summary) Offenses: Increased 2.1 percent.
 - > Incidents that involved multiple offenses: 10.6 percent of all reported incidents.
- SRS (Summary) data may not address the true nature of the crime problem
- Trending eliminates apparent increases in crime volume

WHERE ARE WE TODAY

January 1, 2019 → ONLY NIBRS ACCEPTED IN NC

- ▶ 570 local agencies
- ▶ 404 local agencies have been issued test credentials 71%
- ▶ 302 local agencies have submitted NIBRS data to the test system 53%
- ▶ 69 local agencies have been issued production credentials 12%
- 32 local agencies have submitted NIBRS data to the production system –
 5.6%

We have begun NIBRS testing with the FBI and should have completed our certification within the next several months.
